Staff Changes

Mary Beth Endicott will join our staff as an additional Academic Support Teacher two days per week. Mary Beth previously taught here and will concentrate mostly on assisting junior high students with math, reading, and writing.

Adam Schmidt who has a degree in art education will join us as a part time art teacher. He will teach art once a month to our students in kindergarten-eighth grade and will also moderate our junior high art club.

Terra Nova Tests

We have not yet received the results of the Terra Nova Tests that were administered in April. Apparently the testing company contracted with a different company to score the tests, and this is taking much longer than expected. The diocese has been in contact with the Terra Nova representatives, but at this time we have not received any information as to when we might expect to receive the results.

CCH Math

The Terra Nova math results are used to determine the eighth grade students who will be invited to attend the Algebra I Honors class. However, since we do not have the results, no announcement may be made at this time.

Restroom Renovations

Beginning of School – Family Packet Pickup – August 9, 2017

While it seems too soon to be thinking about this, school will begin before you know it. On Tuesday, August 9^{th} from 9 a.m. -12 noon or 7 p.m. -8 p.m. you will be able to stop by the school office and pick up your family packets and purchase any supplies that must come from the school such as bibles and first grade satchels as well as sign up for working in the cafeteria.

Students Grade K – 8

The first day of school for students in grades K-8 will be on Wednesday, August 16th. There will be noon dismissal on the first day of school. Parents will need to provide transportation for their students from August 16th through August 22 as Kenton County does not begin school until August 23rd. (Maps regarding Private Transportation will be included in the Family Packet) Buses will begin transporting students to school effective Wednesday, August 23.

Kindergarten Meet and Greet

There will be a special Kindergarten "Meet and Greet" on Saturday, August 12^{th} , from 9-11 a.m. Parents and Students are welcome to come and become familiar with their classrooms and teachers. Parents may also bring in the students' supplies at this time. We ask you to tour the classrooms and meet the teachers between 9-10 a.m. Please join us at the Crescent Springs Park (located on Buttermilk Pike across from the Fire House and the Rainbow Child Care Center) from 10-11 a.m. for an opportunity for the students to play and for the kindergarten parents to meet each other.

Grades K – 8 Parent Orientations

The Parent Orientation for grades K-8 will occur on Thursday, August 24^{th} at 7 p.m. A Junior High session will begin at 6:00 p.m. the same evening in the school and then parents will attend the general information session at 7 p.m. in church. Parents of students in grades K-5 will meet their students' teachers after the information session in Chruch.

Preschool Students

There will be an orientation night for the 4 year old preschool parents on Wednesday, August 30 at 7 p.m. in the Faith Community Center in the school. There will be an orientation night for the 3 year old parents on Thursday, August 31st at 7 p.m. in the Faith Community Center in the school. **Both of these orientations are for parents only.** On Friday, September 1st, there will be an open house for the preschool students and their parents from 10 a.m. – noon. Supplies may be brought to the classroom at this time.

Preschool will begin on Tuesday, September 5th for the three year olds and on Wednesday, September 6th for the 4 year olds at 9 a.m. Preschool 3 students are dismissed at 12 noon and Preschool 4 students dismiss at 1 p.m.

Medical Forms – Due Prior to the Start of School

Medical Reminders will be sent by July 1st to Parents of students whose medical files need to be updated during the summer. Students who will be entering grade 6 are required to have had a medical exam within one year prior to entrance. Medical forms were mailed in November to parents whose fifth graders do not meet the medical exam criteria. All forms are due prior to the first day of school. 
Summer Information - Our school office hours will vary throughout the summer.
